Supplemental Environmental Projects Overview

- ❖ Optional program for regulated entities to offset administrative penalties by funding a project
- ❖ Geographic nexus
- ❖ Must have an environmental or public health benefit
- ❖ Government agencies or 501(c)(3) organizations can be the recipients of funding
- ❖ Wide range of funding available (\$50,000 to \$1,000,000)

Funding Opportunity for County EMS Agencies

- ❖ County EMS agencies or fire departments can be the recipients of SEP funds
- ❖ Funds can be used to purchase EMS equipment
- ❖ Funds can be used to train staff
- ❖ Funds can be used to provide health services to the community

SEP Process

- ❖ Organization submits a projects proposal to CDPHE's SEP Library
- ❖ The idea is reviewed to verify it meets CDPHE's SEP policy
- ❖ Idea is added to library for review by entities going through the enforcement process that are interested in funding a SEP
- ❖ If selected, the organization receives the funds from the regulated entity to fund the project
- ❖ Organization needs to report to CDPHE about project's status and deliverables



SEP Project Example

Air Monitors for Hazardous Response

Company: O-I/Owens Brockway

SEP Administrator: Weld County

SEP Amount: \$121,200

- Purchase 4-way gas monitors for volunteer fire departments.
- Purchase remote air monitors for hazardous spills and catastrophic events.

SEP Project Example

LEAF Public Service Building

Company: CEMEX

SEP Administrator: Lyons Elevating All Fund

SEP Amount: \$616,000

- Provides funding to upgrade LEAF's building to provide food, healthcare, and addiction services to underserved individuals in the Lyons area.
- Provides LEAF with an electric van to provide remote services.
