<b>Current practice</b>	Difficulty associated with recognizing patients at risk for difficult intubation
<b>Source</b>	Trauma Peer Review
<b>Best practice</b>	Successful identification of patients requiring a surgical airway or assisted glide scope intubation
<b>Data Source</b>	Key personnel and chart review
<b>Resulting Gap</b>	Ability to quickly and successfully identify at risk patients and successfully obtain and secure an appropriate airway
<b>Objective(s)</b>	1. Recognize patients at risk for difficult intubation
