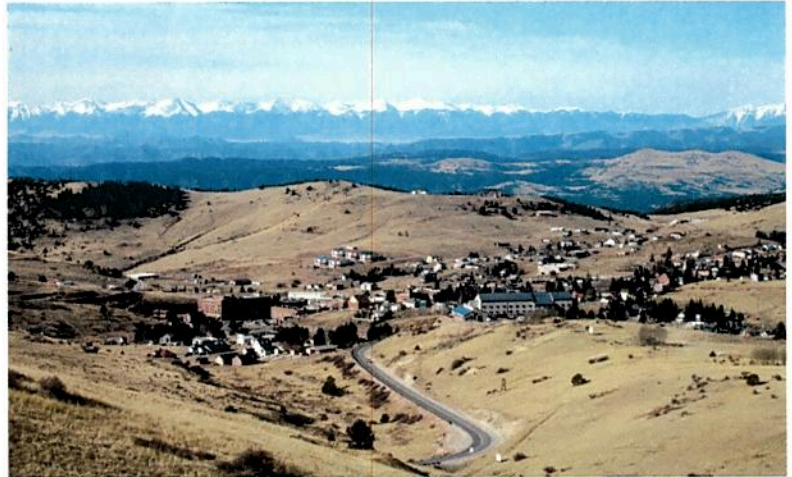

Dr. Cynthia Griffin, DO

Dr. Griffin's passion has always been in Emergency Medical Services. After completing Residency with Virginia Commonwealth University, she sought to continue her career as an Emergency Medical physician with an emphasis in flight EMS. Dr. Griffin's interest in EMS started while as a freshman at Virginia Tech when she joined a rescue squad. She graduated from Virginia Tech with a bachelor's in Cell and Molecular Biology and Spanish. While an undergrad, Dr. Griffin also started her work as a medic, eventually becoming a licensed paramedic. To this day, she still holds a nationally registered Paramedic certificate. Dr. Griffin continued her medical training at Edward Via Virginia College of Osteopathic Medicine and completed her medical degree in Osteopathic Medicine from VCOM. She went on to residency at Virginia Commonwealth University Health System. While in residency, Dr. Griffin completed an Emergency Medical Services track during her second year and was the recipient of their Faculty Award before joining the University of Wisconsin-Madison, School of Medicine and Public Health.

Major Fisher joined the Army in 1992 as an Infantryman. While assigned to the 1st Battalion, 75th Ranger Regiment, he completed an Emergency Medical Technician course and discovered his desire to work in the medical field. His enlistment ended in 1996 and he returned to Indiana. While at Indiana University, he served in the Indiana National Guard as a combat medic. During this time, he served as a squad leader and platoon sergeant. In 2000, he graduated from IU with an Associate's Degree in Paramedic Science. Major Fisher graduated from the Interservice Physician Assistant Program in 2006 and served as a PA in the Republic of Korea in the Joint Security Area. In 2015, he was promoted to the Regimental PA for the 75th Ranger Regiment in Ft. Benning, GA. Major Fisher has been extensively involved in ketamine use at the point of injury for analgesia, the development of REBOA for the Role 1 and point of injury, and TCCC. He is a second-year medical student at Texas A&M College of Medicine. He's also a voting member of the Committee on TCCC and is the Chairman for National Stop the Bleed Day.
